

Welcome to wintry Nayoro

I can't quite recall if it was after I entered elementary school or before that, but my first introduction to skiing was when my uncle took me to a small ski resort that lacked even a lift. Children in Nayoro typically practice skiing on a smaller mountain and then are taken to Piyashiri Ski Resort to learn the ropes before ski classes start in earnest at school. As a child, I loved skiing, and would invite my friends whenever we had vacations to go on little ski adventures here and there. Nayoro's slogan that it offers "Japan's finest snow" has been a common refrain since those times -- but I didn't come to fully appreciate that until adulthood.

The town has a bracing cold, snow falling in crystallized form, and a crunching sound as you walk. The "diamond dust" and "sun pillar" effects seen here are like works of art wrought by the cold and nature, and are enough to take your breath away.

Nayoro's snow, the winter air and sound, and the unique picturesque scenery are things that can be found nowhere else. These wonders are not merely Japan's finest, but world-class, I feel. The snow and winter here are like a bounty we reap from nature, and I encourage you to enjoy them to the fullest.

My first encounter with Nayoro

Discovering the charms of Nayoro through one skiier's vantage point

It has been a long journey thus far. I was skiing while still just a child, and now half a century has gone by with skiing by my side. I've skied slopes around the world. That includes places like Chamonix, Zermatt, and Whistler. One day, I found myself thinking, "Why not put down roots somewhere where the snow is beautiful?" With that, I took a trip through Hokkaido. While I had toured the notable ski slopes around the prefecture, for better or worse, Hokkaido is huge. I knew there were likely parts of the prefecture I had yet to explore, so I rented a car without a destination in main d

From Sapporo, I took the Ororon Line, a route that goes along the coastline of the Sea of Japan up towards Wakkanai at the northernmost point. My first realization was that there wasn't simply more snow the further north you went. With that, I took National Route 40, which bisects Hokkaido, heading southward. While I intended to go as far as Furano, I suddenly recalled that there was a ski resort on the way, so I decided on the spur of the moment to stay overnight. And that place was Nayoro.

I arrived at night. It was -25 degrees Celsius.

My breath seemed to make a crinkling noise in the air, as though all of the moisture was being

sucked out and turning into ice, and the streetlights along the river seemed to form plump little round balls of light. When I blew onto the snow covering the hood of my car, it puffed up in a sudden gust. Each snow crystal could be clearly distinguished. It was so beautiful and mysterious. I just couldn't believe such a place, and such a cold, existed here in Japan.

Nor that such a fantastic, otherworldly winter existed right here.

In the Ainu language, Piyashiri refers to a "rocky mountain." Yet the view from the ski lift reveals a vista in which the trees surviving among this harsh landscape stand out far more than the rocks. As I slid down the slopes and stopped among the glitter of "diamond dust," the stunning view of snow-covered trees below took my breath away. I then continued briskly skiing my way towards the sea and its gently lapping waves. After concluding the first ski of the morning, I found a large group of children congregated in front of a lodge, perhaps readying themselves for a ski lesson.

Just how will the children developing here amid the sublimely beautiful, yet harsh, conditions grow up? What sort of lives will they go on to lead?

Far from coming to an end, my long journey here in Nayoro was just beginning a new chapter.



Nayoro Piyashiri Ski Resort

The resort offers four ski lifts and nine diverse slopes, with an eastern slope spanning 1,800m and consisting of uncompacted snow for a deep snowy slope. At the foothills, you will find not only lodges, but training facilities, and accommodations equipped with hot springs and restaurants.

Nayoro, located in the northernmost part of Hokkaido, is a basin region surrounded by mountains in the east and west. The natural environs here contribute to some of the best powder snow in the world, both in terms of quantity and quality. The extreme winter cold here gives birth to stunning vistas like frozen trees, "snow monsters," and "sun pillars."

Piyashiri Ski Resort consists of nine slopes catering to everyone from beginners to advanced skiers, with undulating slopes; slopes nestled with Japanese white birch, a signature tree of Hokkaido; and FIS-certified slopes tailored to lessons. Choose from the one that best suits your needs. Hokkaido's largest slopestyle park of its kind is where professional snowboarders active on the world stage cut their teeth. At the foothills of the ski resort are hotels, as well as lodges serving food, plus hot springs. Warm up in one of these spots after your skiing session.

Snow Activities

Experience the finest snow amidst this beautiful forest

Drive five minutes by car from the Piyashiri ski jump in the direction of the city and you will arrive at the Nayoro Kenkoh no Mori Country Route, which is SAJ certified. Just as breathtaking as the dynamic performances you will see on the ski jump is the skiing by top athletes in training here, which you can see up close. The route can be walked by anyone from beginners to those more advanced, with equipment offered for rental free of charge at the management building. Stroll through this rich forest, consisting of signature Hokkaido greenery like the Japanese white birch and larch, soaking in nature's energy and revitalizing body and mind.













Play, stumble, and laugh: Enjoy the snow to the fullest

The winter and snowy vistas here are the best in Japan. If you want to enjoy yourself to the fullest, try snowshoeing or snowboarding ("snow toys," a snowboard without bindings), or let it all out as you fly down the slopes in a sled. You can also enjoy activities like snow picnics and snowmobiling.

There are twelve accommodation facilities in the city, many of which are fully equipped with waxing rooms. Pick the place that is best for you: you will find everything from cottages in which you can relax with friends and family, business hotels for the convenience-minded traveler, as well as hotels that offer spacious Japanese-style rooms for groups or those with children in tow.



Forest Relaxation Village Cottages

The cottages near the cross-country skiing route are detached single buildings exuding the warmth of wood. In addition, the Center House here is a lodge with occupancy for 20 people.


This shop specializes in curry, hamburgers, and coffee and is located within the shopping area in front of the station. The curry served here features a unique blend of spices.
